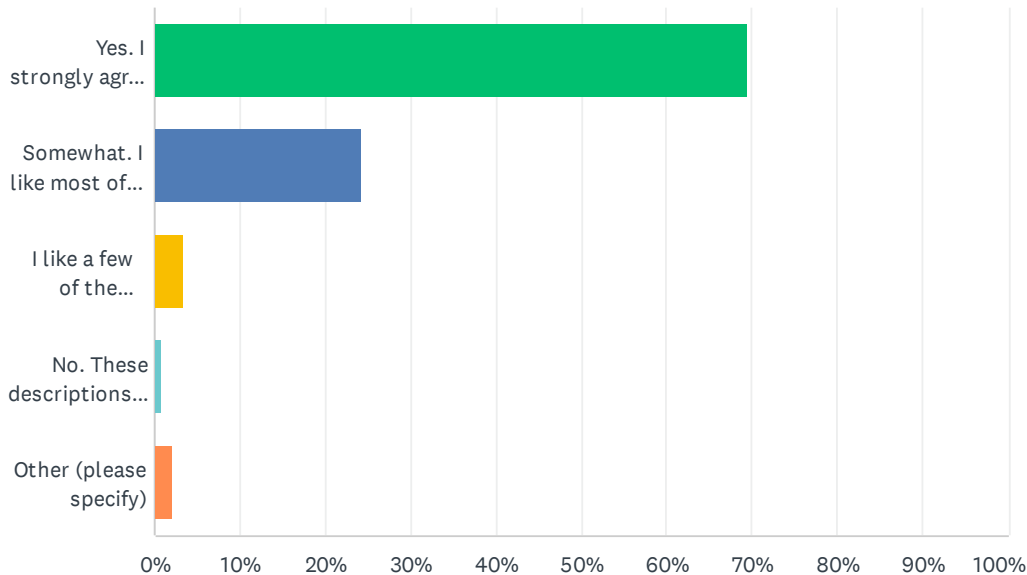


Q1 Does the list of descriptions adequately describe the experience you would like to have as a parent/caregiver in Duluth Public Schools?

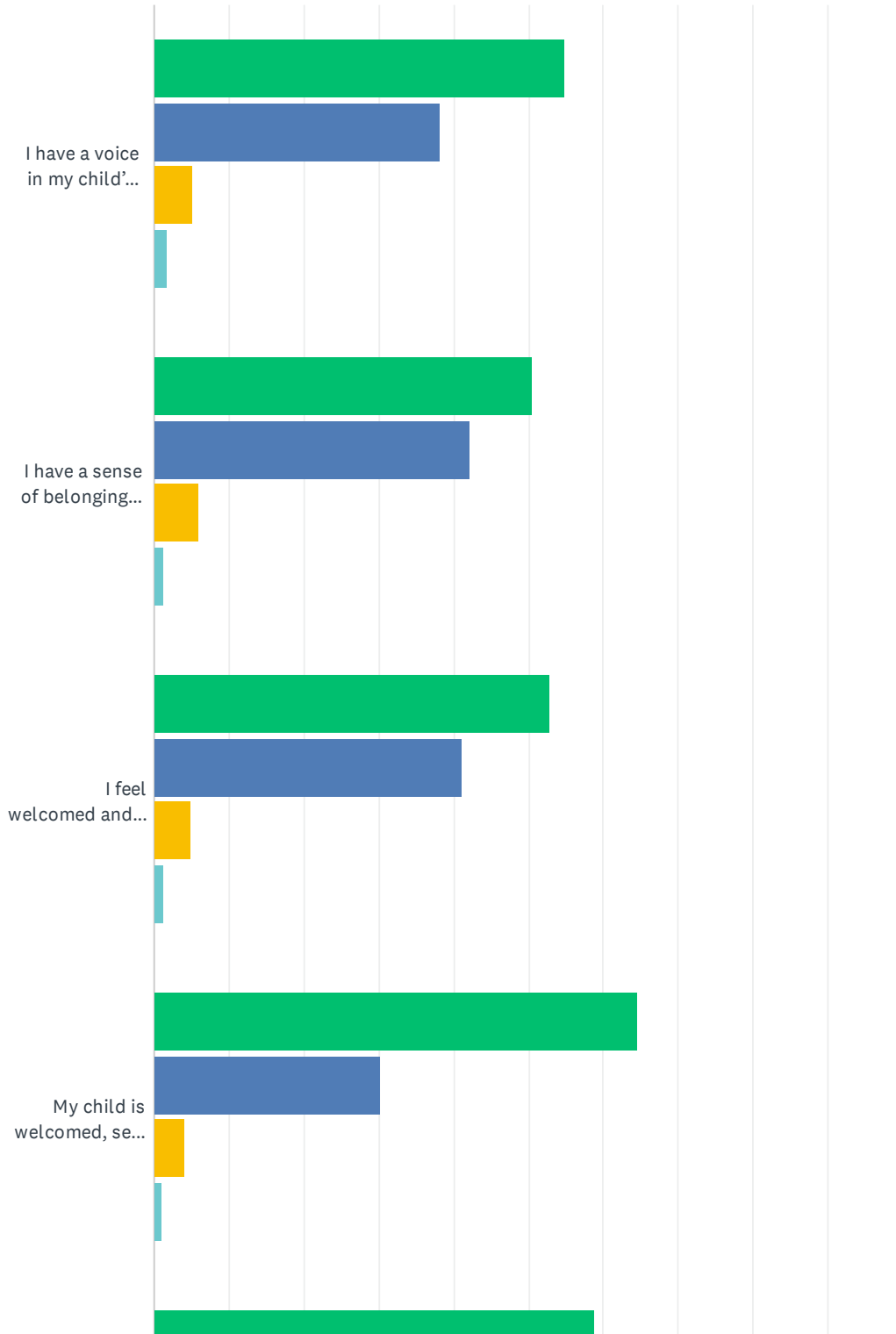

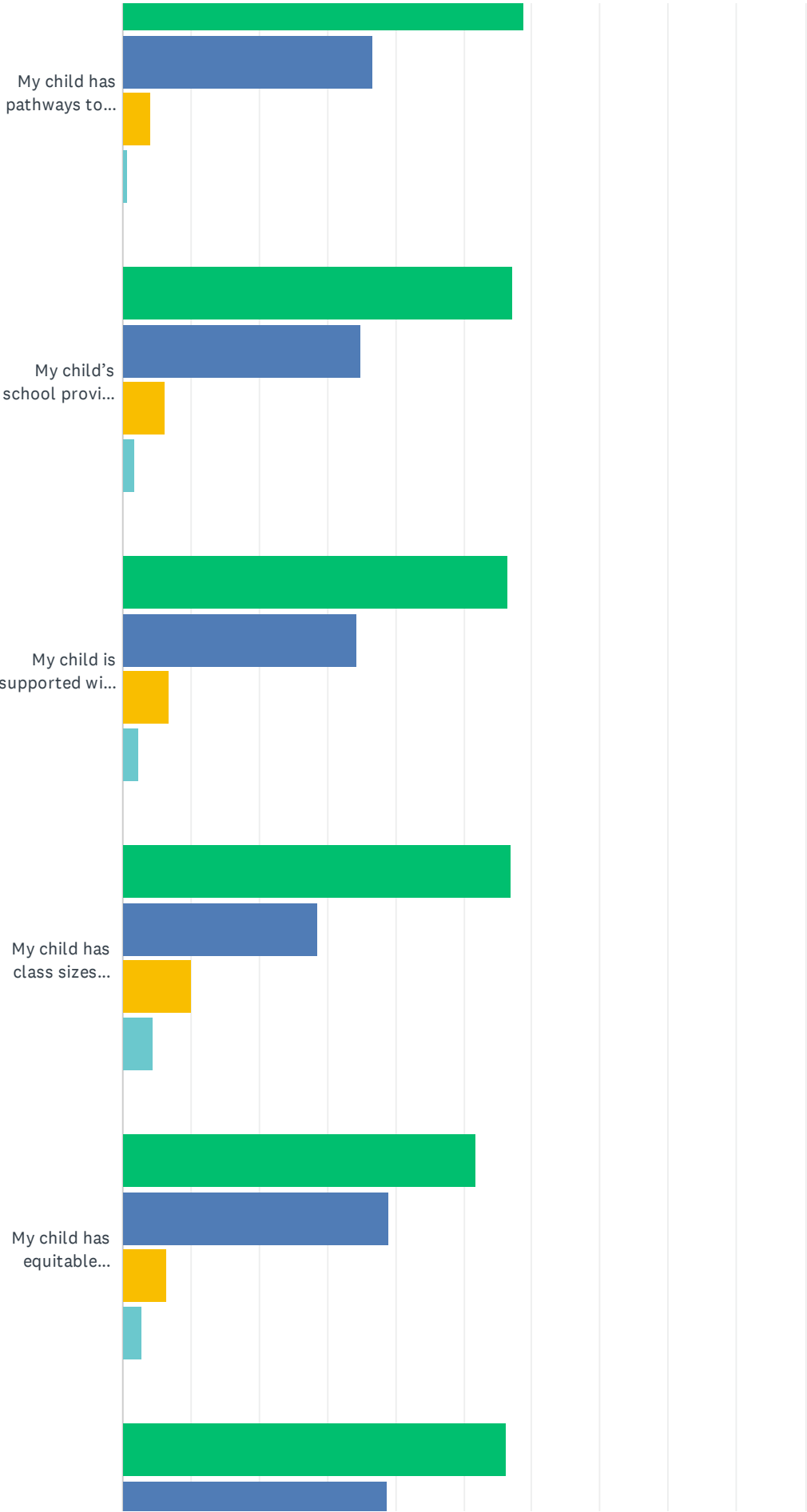

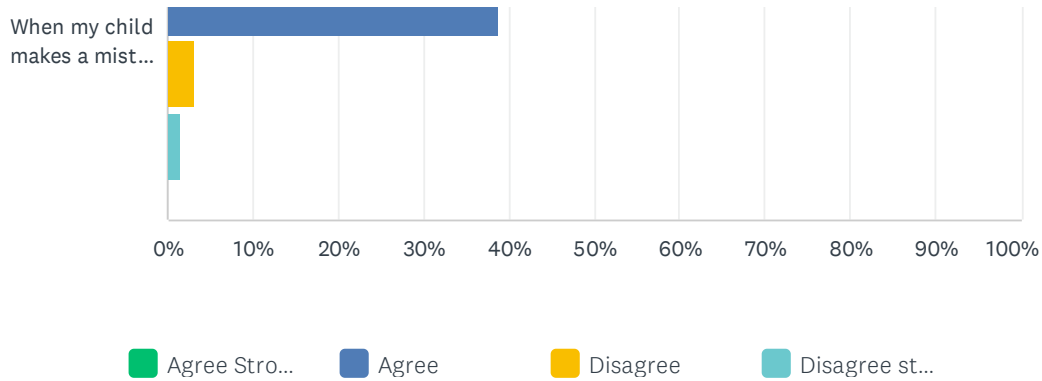

Duluth Public Schools Family Desired Daily Experience Survey 2022



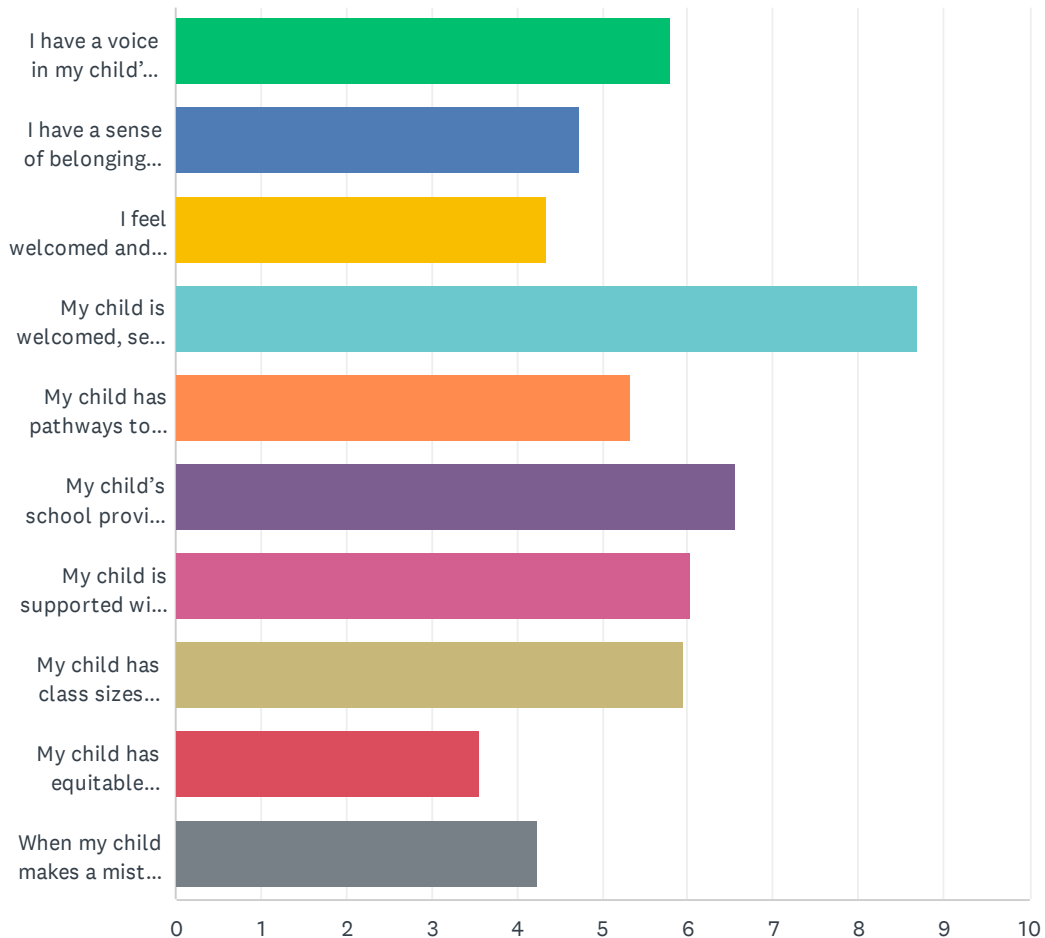

We live in a beautiful city with tremendous parks and natural places and I think the schools should be better able to take advantage of this. Outdoor opportunities could be as simple as longer recess and outdoor Physical Education classes, but also investing in school forests, gardens and outdoor classroom. Studies show that kids learn better when they have time outdoors and kids at all ages should have more opportunities to be outside. I also really appreciate the statement and the sentiment behind, "When my child makes a mistake at school they are treated fairly." But, I think that there needs to be further definition about what fairly means so that it's equitable and understood by parents, students and staff. Finally, I think the district has made significant strides in communication outreach to families, but I think there is still much room for growth. I do think that this needs to be a priority for all families, but especially those where English is not their first language, are transient or families just starting in the school system. There is too much assumed knowledge and it's really hard to find key information. 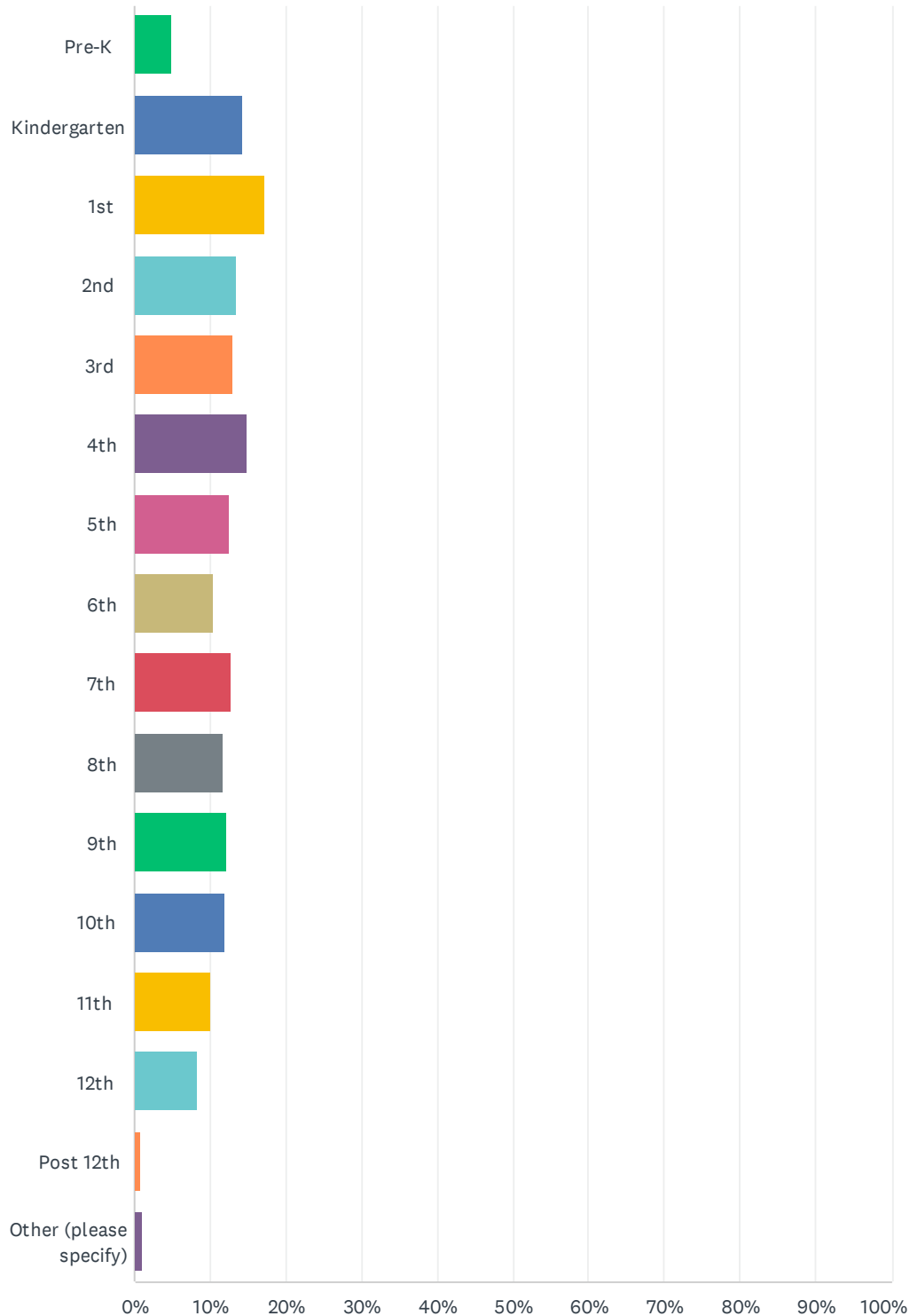

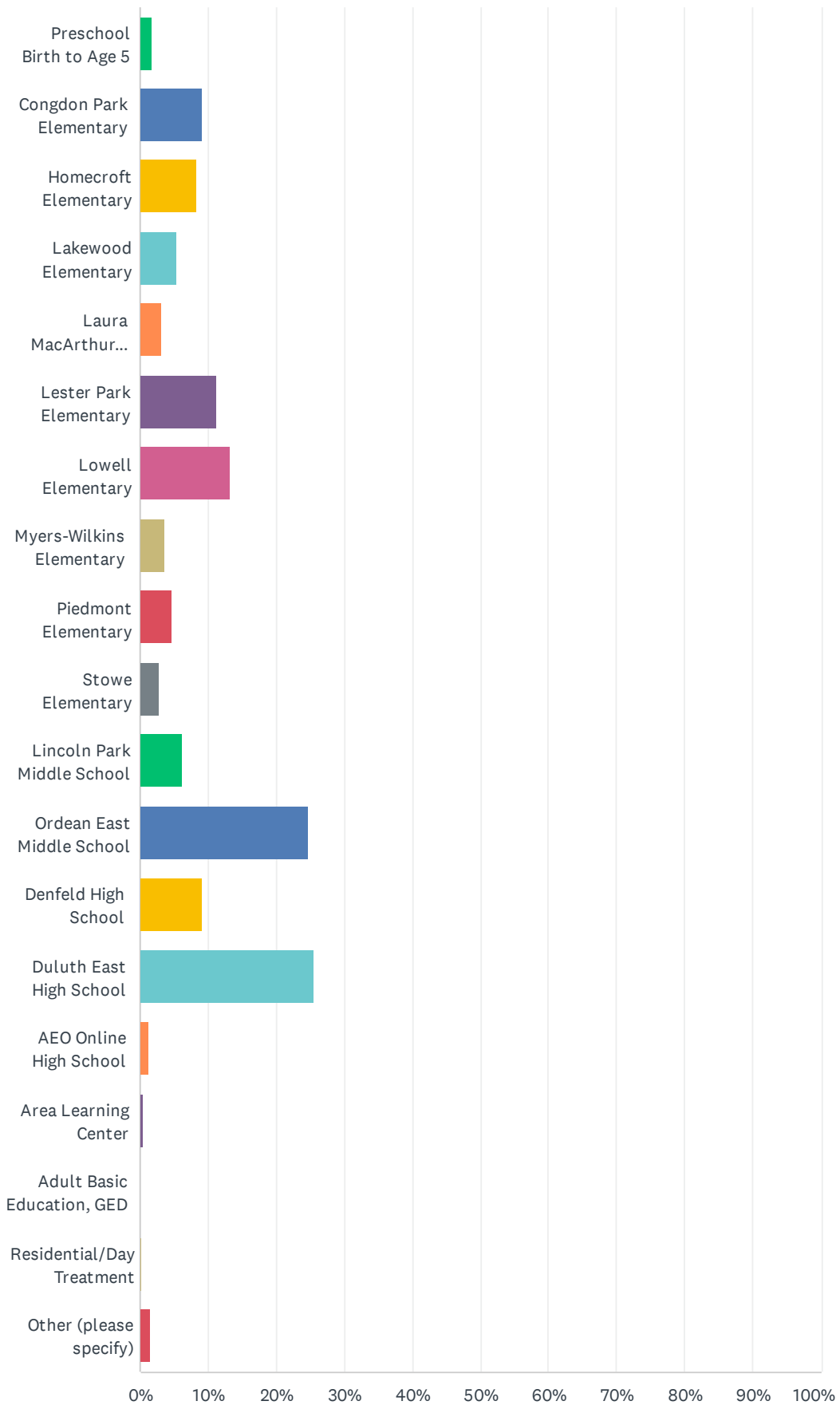

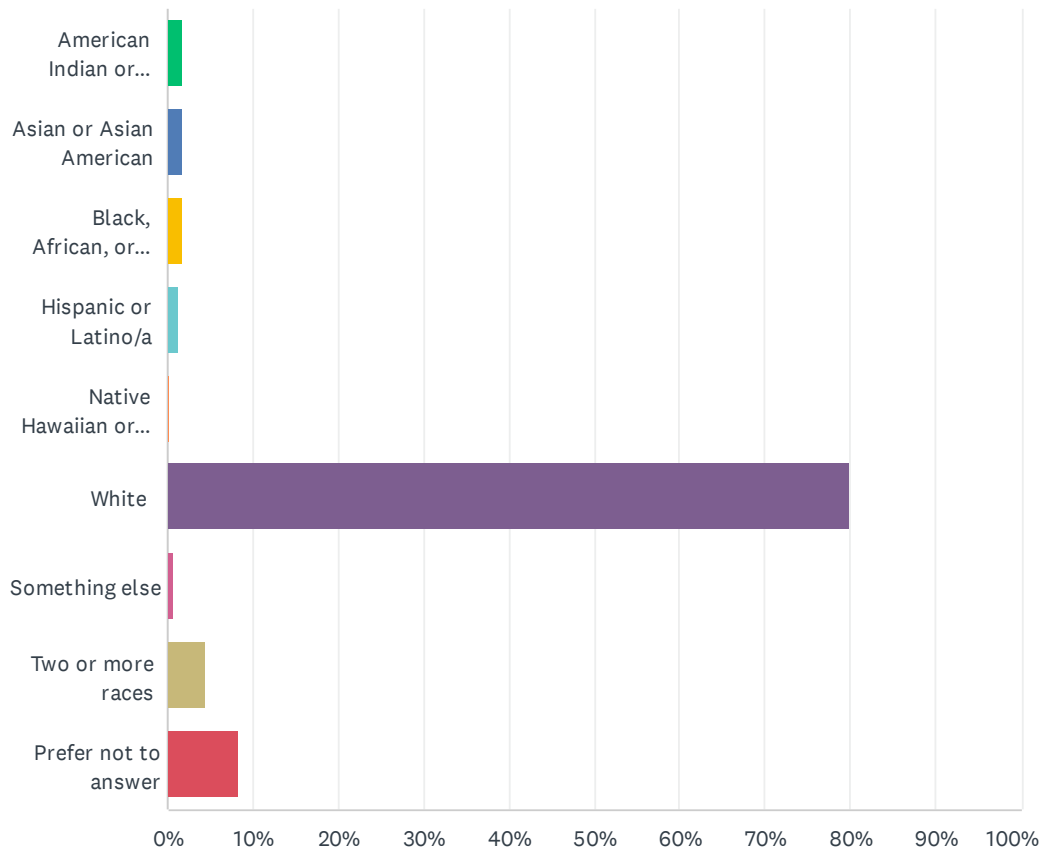
