21st Century Skills

Encourage your child to

- solve everyday problems on their own and by collaborating with others
- be an independent thinker
- ·set and achieve goals
- take on household responsibilities
- express ideas and feelings in a variety of ways
- · use print resources and digital tools for inquiry, research, productivity, and enjoyment

English-Language Arts

Encourage your child to

- check out books at the public library
- · read to a family member
- · create a fun reading spot in the home
- · have a family "read-in" night with silent and aloud reading, snacks, and games
- notice they types of text used on products, games, toys, signs, etc
- · write to family members to inform, persuade, and tell stories
- · share their favorite parts of books
- · use a computer to create a movie or other project on a topic of interest
- · record themselves reading their favorite book and share with others
- · communicate with family and friends with various forms of technology
- · engage in conversation for a variety of purposes and audiences - at the dinner table, meeting new people, etc

Mathematics

Encourage your child to

- connect two-digit adding problems to everyday life (cooking, shopping, etc)
- · practice addition and subtraction facts
- · use coins to pay for things at a store
- · skip count by 2s, 3s, 5s, and 10s
- · identify shapes they see in the world
- · practice reading analog and digital clocks
- · practice estimating items

Music

Encourage your child to

- listen to music from a variety of cultures and genres
- · move, clap, dance, drum to a musical beat
- sing a variety of songs
- enjoy community concerts with family and friends
- · share and compare songs you like with those they like

Science

Encourage your child to

- · observe animal life at a local park
- · create a daily weather journal
- · graph rainfall or snowfall for a month
- · explore balance and motion with toys
- · help grow a family garden
- · experiment with melting ice cubes in different environments
- · make a list of items in the home that are solids or liquids

Social Studies

Encourage your child to

- · plan and carry out a lemonade stand
- · research and create a family timeline or family tree
- · discuss family members' rights and responsibilities
- · create a map of their home or neighborhood
- · go with you to vote
- · find common features in a variety of cultures

Visual and Media Arts

Encourage your child to

- · notice and draw building components and styles
- · observe and draw foreground, middleground, and background
- · weave with papers and fibers
- · discuss how backgrounds in movies impact the story
- · sculpt an animal out of everyday materials

Health and Physical Education

Encourage your child to

- help plan healthy meals and snacks
- · help select new healthy options at the grocery store
- · create or update the family emergency plans
- · be active for at least 30 minutes daily outside of school
- track their own distance or time progress in endurance activities (running, biking, swimming, etc)
- · limit electronics usage
- · play together with the family
- · try new physical activities
