

# **How Can I Support My Child's Learning?**

## 3rd Grade

### 21st Century Skills

Encourage your child to

- •find alternative ways to solve a problem
- · try something on his or her own first, before getting assistance
- · use positive self-talk in order to confidently make decisions
- · share ideas verbally, visually, and through writing
- · explain the importance of saying "no" to negative influences
- · use print resources and digital tools for inquiry, research, productivity, and enjoyment

## **English-Language Arts**

Encourage your child to

- · ask family members about books they are reading
- · try to figure out the meaning of new words
- · read aloud to family members
- · describe the personalities of characters in a story
- · keep a story journal
- · write thank you notes
- · look at photographs and discuss memories
- · practice writing emails with correct capitalization and punctuation

#### **Mathematics**

Encourage your child to

- teach you their method of working through math problems
- · estimate the total price of items before paying
- · practice addition, subtraction, and multiplication facts
- practice telling how much time has passed for different activities
- · identify right triangles, rectangles, parallelograms, trapezoids, etc.
- · make charts and graphs of your family's favorite foods, activities, etc.

#### Music

Encourage your child to

- listen to music from a variety of cultures and genres
- · talk with you about lyrics in music
- · participate in opportunities to sing or play instruments in school or in the community
- · attend music performances with family and friends
- · talk with you about the different ways they use music to express themselves

#### Science

Encourage your child to

- · enjoy a night out watching the stars or early morning sunrise
- experiment with different levels of voice volume in a variety of settings
- · plant a garden and journal observations
- · compare and contrast different insects
- · collect seeds from a variety of fruits or other plants
- · describe the structure of vegetables at the dinner table
- · on a walk, collect and compare leaves

#### **Social Studies**

Encourage your child to

- · discuss the election and voting process with family members
- discuss with family members a person's responsibilities within the community
- · discuss pros and cons of various decisions
- · create and discuss maps that show various physical and human-made features
- · examine their birth certificate or other documents and artifacts to find information about the past
- · imagine how someone would have performed a modern task in ancient times

#### Visual and Media Arts

Encourage your child to

- · help plan family visits to art museums
- · create a personal story with art materials
- · analyze how artists tell stories in pictures and movies
- · analyze and create artworks to persuade
- · find public art in the community

## **Health and Physical Education**

Encourage your child to

- plan and make a balanced meal
- · participate in daily exercise activities
- · explain the importance of taking care of your body and practicing proper hygiene
- · limit electronics usage
- · track their own distance or time progress in endurance activities
- · plan active family activities
