- Attend school and continue in the school they attended before becoming homeless and receive transportation to that school and school programs.
- Receive the same special programs and services, if needed, as provided to all other children served in these programs.
- Have enrollment disputes quickly addressed, students must be allowed to enroll and attend classes while the school and you seek to resolve the enrollment dispute.

The McKinney Vento Homeless Education Assistance Act and the Duluth Public Schools, District 709 assures the educational rights above for homeless and highly mobile students.
